BRUSHING YOUR CATS TEETH





- Periodontal disease con lead to tooth loss and affects most cats by the time they ore 3 years old.
- Depending on your cat's overall health. bacteria from periodontal disease can spread 10 affect other organs.
- Hove your cot's teeth checked by your veterinarian before you start brushing them
- Make toothbrushing enjoyable for your cat by rewording him or her immediately after each session.
- Be very patient when teaching your cay to accept toothbrushing.
- If your cat won't tolerate toothbrushing, your veterinarian can recommend plaque-preventative products for your cat.

• SIGNS OF DENTAL PROBLEMS:

- Bod breath
- · Sensitivity around the mouth
- Loss of appetite and/or weight
- · Yellow or brown deposits on the teeth
- Bleeding, inflamed and withdrawn gums
- Loose or missing teeth
- · Pawing al the mouth or face
- · Difficulty chewing
- Hissing and running away from the food bowl

PERIODONTAL DISEASE- WHY BRUSH?

Depending on your cot s overall health. bacteria from periodontal disease con spread to offed other organs One of the best ways to help prevent periodontal disease is to brush your cots teeth doily. or at least multiple times a week



Cats are never too young to start having their teeth brushed at home. In fact, the younger they are, the better. Have your cats teeth checked by your veterinarian before you start brushing them.

<u>Note:</u> Do not use toothpaste for people or baking soda to brush your cats teeth. Human toothpaste is made with ingredients that can cause stomach upset if swallowed (e.g., detergents, fluoride).

Cat toothpaste comes in different flavors (e.g. poultry. beef. fish) You may need to try a couple flavors to find the one your cat likes the best. Your veterinarian may recommend a dental cleaning to remove any existing plaque and tartar, which contribute to periodontal disease.

If your cot has severe dental disease, extraction of the affected teeth may be recommended Follow your veterinarian's recommendation on how long to wait ofter dental cleaning or extraction before brushing your cat's teeth.
